Most important articles/questions in judgements

Article 2: Scope of application

- Geographically (cross border, domestic jo Art. 31)
- Timely: no application before official ratification

Article 3: Taking over, carriage and delivery of the goods

- lack of definition of the term „delivery“ and additional national provisions according to Art. 29.
- unloading of goods: omission of the convention (jo. Art. 6 par. 4)

Article 6: obligations of the shipper

- par. 4: no reference to “unloading” omission of the convention / editorial error? Additional national law or beyond the wording of par. 4.: differently interpreted in G and NL.

Most important articles/questions in judgements

Article 16: Liability for loss

- Liability for contamination of goods
- Contribution in General Average considered as loss

Article 25: Nullity of contractual stipulations

- exclusion of liability for navigational error to be agreed by parties or excluded by pre-formulated general conditions

Most important articles/questions in judgements

Article 1: Right to limit liability persons entitled to limit liability

- Broad interpretation of those entitled to limit liability
- Slot charterer included in this concept
- Term “charterer” in relation to pusher and barge: no grounds for distinction between principal and sub-charterer

Article 2:

- Constitution of water pollution fund for environmental contamination rather than property fund.
- No limitation of liability for costs of a fire service intervention
